## Report of Student Satisfaction Survey on Teaching-Learning and Evaluation

 (TLE) Process (2022-2023)
### 2.7 Student Satisfaction Survey (SSS) on Overall Institution Performance

In this academic session, feedback from the stakeholders was collected through an online questionnaire which was made available on the college website in the feedback section (Session 2022-23).

## FEEDBACK ANALYSIS:

A total of 109 responses were collected through the online feedback form. Amongst these respondents, $55.05 \%$ were females and $44.95 \%$ were males. After analyzing the feedback on the overall TLE process of the institution, the report along with remarks and recommendations was discussed among allteaching staff to improvise the TLE process. Overall students' satisfaction with the TLE process was measured on the basis of their learning experiences.
The answers of different questions have been summarized below:

1) How much of the syllabus was covered inthe class?

Out of the total students who participated in a survey, about $88.9 \%$ answered that $70-100 \%$ of the syllabus was covered in class and $7.3 \%$ of students answered that up to $55-70 \%$ syllabus was covered. Only $3.6 \%$ of students rated syllabus completion to be less than $54 \%$ and below $30 \%$.


## 2) How well did the teachers prepare for theclasses?

Around $79.8 \%$ of students responded that teachers prepare thoroughly and satisfactorily. Only $20.1 \%$ of students believed that teachers prepared poorly or
 indifferently or won't teach at all.
3) How well are the teachers able
tocommunicate?
--- Always effective rating was given by $68.8 \%$ of students, whereas $11.9 \%$ students believe that teachers were only sometimes effective. About $8.2 \%$ students think that teachers satisfactorily communicated and only $5.2 \%$ rated that teachers were generally effective or had very poor communication.


## 4) The teacher approach to teaching can best be described as

--The teacher's approach to teaching was described as excellent and very good by $72.4 \%$ of students, whereas $27.5 \%$ of students described it as good and no students described it as fair or poor.


## 5) Fairness of internal evaluation process by the teachers

--About $88.07 \%$ of students find the internal evaluation process by the teachers as always and usually fair. Only $11.9 \%$ of students find the internal evaluation process by the teachers occasionally or rarely or never fair.

6) Ways your performance in assignments was discussed with you?
--About $82.5 \%$ of students approved that their performance in assignments was discussed every time and usually. About $17.4 \%$ of students reported that their performance was discussed occasionally, rarely or never.

--About $64.2 \%$ of students approved that the institution takes an active interest in promoting internship, student exchange, and field visit opportunities for them regularly and often. Whereas $27.5 \%$ of students opted for sometimes. Only $8.2 \%$ of students reveal that the institute rarely and never takes an active interest.
8) The teaching and mentoring process in your institution facilitate your cognitive, social, and emotional growth.
--About $80.7 \%$ of students believe that the teaching and mentoring process in the institution facilitates their cognitive, social, and emotional growth significantly and very well and $19.2 \%$ said that it is facilitated moderately, marginally or not at all.

## 9) The institution provides multiple opportunities to learn and grow

--About $89.9 \%$ of students agree and strongly agree that the institution provides multiple opportunities to learn and grow. About $7.3 \%$ of students have a neutral opinion, whereas only $2.7 \%$ of students disagree and strongly disagree.
10)Teacher informs you about your expected competencies, course outcomes, and program outcomes
--About $86.2 \%$ of students agree that the teacher informs them about their expected competencies, course outcomes, and program outcomes every time and usually. About $11 \%$ of students believe that teachers inform them occasionally, and only $2.7 \%$ of students opted for rarely and never.

11) Your mentor does a necessarily followup with an assigned task for you
--About $86.2 \%$ of students feel that their mentor does a necessary follow-up with an assigned task with them every time and usually. Occasional follow-up was observed by $11 \%$ of students and only $2.7 \%$ of students opted for rarely and never.

## 12) The teacher illustrates the concept through examples and applications

--About $88.9 \%$ of students agree that the teacher illustrates concepts through examples and applications every time and usually. Only $11 \%$ of students think that teacher illustrates concepts through examples and applications occasionally, rarely, or never.

## 13) The teacher identifies your strength and encourages you by providing the right level of challenges

--About $84.4 \%$ of students fully and reasonably agree that the teacher identifies their strengths and encourages them by providing the right level of challenges and $14.6 \%$ of students believe that the teacher partially, slightly or is unable to identify their strengths and encourages them by providing the right level of challenges.

## 14) Teachers are able to identify your weakness and help you to overcome them

--About $86.2 \%$ of students feel that teachers are able to identify their weaknesses and help them to overcome them every time and usually. About $6.4 \%$ of students think that teachers are occasionally able to identify their weaknesses and help them to overcome them. Only $7.3 \%$ of students opted for rarely and never.

15) The institution makes efforts to engage students in monitoring, reviewing, and continuous quality improvements of the teaching-learning process.
--About $88.07 \%$ of students agree and strongly agree that the institution makes effort to engage students in a monitoring review and continuous quality improvement of the teaching-learning process. About $11 \%$ of students opted for neutral and $0.9 \%$ opted for disagree and strongly disagree.
16) The institute or teacher uses studentcentric methods, such as experiential learning, participative learning, and problemsolving methodologies for enhancing learning experiences.
--About $82.5 \%$ of students think that institutions and teachers use student-centric methods to a great or moderate extent. About $17.4 \%$ of students opted for somewhat, very little or not at all.

## 17) Teachers Encourage you to participate in extracurricular activities.

--About $87.15 \%$ of students agree and strongly agree that they receive encouragement from teachers to participate in extra-curricular activities. About $10 \%$ of students opted for neutral and $2.7 \%$ of students disagreed and strongly disagree.
18) Efforts are made by the institute /teachers to inoculate soft skills, life skills, and employability skills to make you ready for the world of work
--About $85.3 \%$ of students agree that to a great and moderate extent efforts are made by the institution or teachers to inculcate soft skills, life skills, and employability skills to make them ready for the world of work. About $14.6 \%$ of students opted for somewhat, very little, or not at all.

19) What percentage of teachers use ICT tools such as LCD Projector, Multimedia, etc. while teaching?
--Around $25.6 \%$ of students rated for a range above $90 \%, 38.5 \%$ of students rated for a range of $70-90 \%$, whereas $25.6 \%$ of students rated for $30-69 \%$, and $10.09 \%$ of students rated for less than $29 \%$.

## 20) The overall quality of the teaching-

 learning process in your institute is very good--About $87.15 \%$ of students strongly agree and agree that the overall quality of the teaching-learning process in the institute is very good. About $7.3 \%$ of students were neutral. Only $5.5 \%$ of students opted for disagree and strongly disagree.

21) Give three observations/suggestions to improve the teaching-learning experience in your institution
Most of the students responded positively to majority of questions. This survey indicates the happiness of students with the teaching and facilities provided by the college. Many students responded that they are highly satisfied and do not have any suggestions. Few prominent suggestions are as follows:
$>$ ICT-based courses should be offered
$>$ More projects and real-time problems should be solved
> More research-oriented courses should be introduced
> Monthly updates on technology advancements can be given
